From the Pastor's Pen

I get mad at my computer sometimes. I will use "Word" to compose a message to a family member or friend. As I am about to conclude the message, I will hit a wrong key and it will all disappear. I growl, calm down, and begin anew, trying to remember what I wrote. Technology can be frustrating, but also can be very helpful. You can google almost anything and you will get the information you want. But technology can also be dangerous. The danger is what I want to comment about.

There is an on-going debate about whether children should have access to the Internet, at least unlimited access.

Should there be age limits? Does the computer help or hinder learning skills? Are young people, especially teenagers, more withdrawn from social contacts because so much time is spent on the Web? Studies in sociology continue to grapple with these questions and draw conclusions. Certainly if the attachment to the cell phone has an effect on family life and family time, changes need to be made.

The real concern that I want to address is the availability of pornography on line. Pornographic materials can be accessed by people of any age. Teenagers are especially drawn to such material. But men (mostly) and women of any age can become addicted. Pornography paints a picture of material that debase the meaning and beauty of the human body and sexuality. Porn can lead to crimes that hurt and abuse. So I caution parents to be very solicitous about what how their children use media and the moral danger porn can inflict. Of course adults can be easily led to an abuse we call lust, one of the seven deadly sins. Beware. Be cautious. Be prayerful. Be wise in using the Internet.

My prayers are with you each day.

Meditating Moments



I feel confident that most of you have seen photographs of Pope Leo XIV greeting crowds of people in Rome and throughout his travels. I especially gravitated to this one taken during his recent trip to countries in Africa, which so clearly shows the diversity of people who embrace our faith, as well as the inclusivity which Pope Leo expresses. As you might remember, he also consistently proclaims the message of peace. Inclusivity, unity, forgiveness, and love which are centered in the teachings of Jesus and central to our faith as Catholics.

Last Sunday we celebrated Pentecost and today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Let me suggest that Pentecost celebrates not only the coming of the Holy Spirit on everyone gathered that day, but also the unity felt among people of different nations as they understood St. Peter’s preaching in their own languages. Unlike the story of the Tower of Babel, where people did not understand one another due to speaking different languages, at Pentecost differing languages were not a hindrance for understanding. Today there seems to be so many things (language, culture, economic status, tradition, race, and opinions) which separate and divide us, even within our Church, communities, and families. Yet I am called to live the gospel message of love. Celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity makes me think of the meaning/symbolism of what we Christians profess, God in three persons. I have particular images of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit which are quite different. When I pray, I address my prayers either to Jesus or *Abba*, but rarely to the Holy Spirit. Conversely I begin prayer, acknowledging the three persons of the trinity as I make the sign of the cross. I realize I cannot truly divide the Trinity, Father, Son, and Spirit unified into one God: “We [I] believe in One God” as stated in our creed.

Getting to the point, if all humans are created in the image and likeness of God, are we not all brothers and sisters? As such there is a unity, ordained by God which cannot be broken. So why, therefore, do I try and break or at least ignore this unity? Why do I allow language, culture, race, religion, tradition, political opinions, or wealth to separate me from my brothers and sisters? Saying I do not have the means to make a difference is nothing more than an excuse for my failure to live as Jesus teaches. I know that I cannot do everything for everyone. I do know, however, there are small things I can do to bridge this great divide I as a human have created. I know, everything begins with Jesus and His insistence on loving one another.

This weekend Prayer Cards will be available in the Gathering Space along with sign-up sheets for your commitment to participating in this Novena.

We need at least 20 people to commit to adoration every day for 1 ½ hours or at least 30 people to commit to one hour a day during the 9 days of the novena and at least 30 people to commit to one Works of Mercy during the 9 days of the novena. Corporal Works of Mercy:

1. Feed the hungry: Provide food to those in need.
2. Give drink to the thirsty: Offer water to the parched.
3. Clothe the naked: Donate clothes.
4. Shelter the homeless: Offer a place to stay.
5. Visit the imprisoned: Spend time with those in prison.
6. Care for the sick: Attend to those who are ill.
7. Bury the dead: Ensure the deceased are laid to rest.

Spiritual Works of Mercy:

1. Instruct the ignorant: Teach those who lack knowledge.
2. Counsel the doubtful: Offer guidance to the uncertain.
3. Admonish the sinner: Encourage repentance gently.
4. Bear wrongs patiently: Endure wrongs without retaliation.
5. Forgive willingly: Let go of grudges.
6. Comfort the afflicted: Support those who are suffering.
7. Pray for the living and the dead: Intercede through prayer

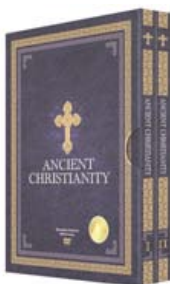



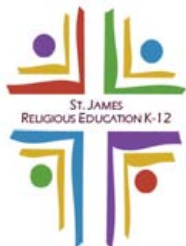

Trinity Sunday, officially called "The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity," is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and doctrine rather than a person or event. On Trinity Sunday, Christians remember and honor the eternal God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Trinity is one of the most fascinating - and controversial - Christian teachings. The Trinity is described as a "mystery." By mystery the Church does not mean a riddle, but rather the Trinity is a reality above our human comprehension that we may begin to grasp, but ultimately must know through worship, symbol, and faith. It has been said that mystery is not a wall to run up against, but an ocean in which to swim.

Essentially the Trinity is the belief that God is one in essence (Greek *ousia*), but distinct in person (Greek *hypostasis*). The Greek word for person means "that which stands on its own," or "individual reality," and does not mean the persons of the Trinity are three human beings. Therefore Christians believe that the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are somehow distinct from one another (not divided though), yet completely united in will and essence. How can this be?

Well, think of the sight of two eyes. The eyes are distinct, yet one and undivided in their sight. Another illustration to explain the Trinity is the musical chord. Think of a C-chord. The C, E, and G notes are all distinct notes, but joined together as one chord the sound is richer and more dynamic than had the notes been played individually. The chords are all equally important in producing the rich sound, and the sound is lacking and thin if one of the notes is left out.

Each person of the Trinity interpenetrates one another, and each has distinct roles in creation and redemption. For instance, God the Father created the world through the Son and the Holy Spirit hovered over the waters at creation. The Trinity is not pointless metaphysical speculation, but about the heart of our salvation.

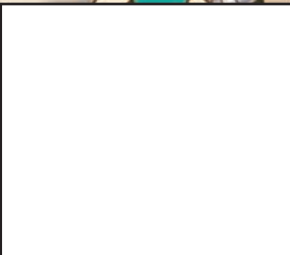
