From the Pastor's Pen

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in her/him, says the Lord." (John 6:57)

Two Sundays ago we completed the liturgical Season of Easter with the celebration of Pentecost and resumed the second part of the Ordinary Time Season at the eighth week in Ordinary Time. Series of three's in any happening often triggers our curiosity in us and tend to suggest a sense of perfection or completeness in our imagination. Spiritually, the series of three consecutive celebrations, Pentecost, Holy Trinity, and Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ which sandwiching in between the Easter Season and Ordinary Time does provoke in us a sense of fullness.

"You become what you eat," the saying goes.

Recalling the days of social distancing, while being homebound we rubbed elbows more frequently and showed our true colors more readily, though not intentionally. In effect such were rare opportunities for us to truly know one another, an essential element in building and strengthening family bond. By being homebound we had opportunities to resurrect some family customary activities, such as together eating daily meals and praying daily prayers. These events have time-proven that "families that eat together stick together" and "families that pray together stay together."

In certain cultures, particularly mediterranean culture, enemies do not sit together at the same table for meals, only friends. And in many cultures when people frequently share meals at the same table they form friendship and deepen their bond. We are sharing the same meal table at home and the same Eucharistic table in church. What is becoming of us, at home as well as in church?

For many of us, the rubbing elbows and showing true colors might have been too long during the pandemic time; but for some others it might have been not long enough to really get to know each other and be truly in communion with each other in our own families and/or communities. The wandering Israelites took 40 years in the desert to come together as one people who collectively reckoned and worshiped God. Let us pray that it will not take that long for us to become a parish community filled with compassion and understanding as we keep gathering in our sacred space letting the divine infuse us with the Holy Spirit and nourish us with the Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Let us strive to come into union with God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, existentially and sacramentally as we come into union with one another, at home as well as at church.

Meditating Moments



1. “In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.” (Genesis 1:1-2 NRSV) In the beginning the **Spirit of Creation** blew over the void, thus the beginning of our beautiful world and existence. 2. “Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ..The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes.” (John 3:5-6, 8 NRSV) **Spirit of Renewing Life**, in the first moment of my existence, you breathed new life into me. Help me continue to feel your breath and hear your voice above the clamor of life surrounding me. 3. “Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest,; (Matthew 11:28 NRSV) **Spirit of Restlessness**, lift me from my longing for answers. Guide me to trust in your love. 4. “And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind. . .All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit.” (Acts 1:2,4 NRSV) **Spirit of Rushing Wind**, help me speak and live the gospel message without fear.

In recent days the Midwest seems to be in the midst of thunder storms, packing the punch of high winds. Returning from a visit to my sister in Virginia, I fought high winds and pouring rain across six states. A week ago (June 1st), I awoke to storm sirens around 1:00 AM. I feel blessed both by my safe return and freed from damage to my home from the high winds and storm. Praying in thanksgiving I realized God’s Spirit is often describe in sacred scripture as rushing, sometimes violent wind. Spiritual teacher Christine Valters Painter prayer to God’s Spirit (from which I borrowed the above **titles**) concludes with the following words:

“Blessing of the wind be upon me.
 May my sails billow wide,
 May I breathe deeply the gift of inspiration,
 May I be carried to the place of my resurrection,
 May I be truly free.

As I think about my life in the Spirit, I realize God blessed me with the Holy Spirit at my conception, and I pray I will continue to feel the presence of the Spirit until my natural death. I also pray that God will lead me to an awareness of the Spirit’s ever presence in my life, lovingly guiding me.

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 12



Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is an important liturgical day in the Catholic Church.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ.

The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord—the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.

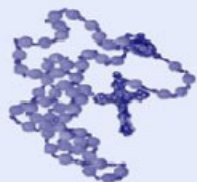

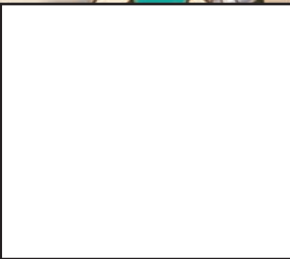
