From the Pastor's Pen

Excitement is growing about the celebration of our country's semiquincentennial, our 250th anniversary as a nation, with the public proclamation of the Declaration of Independence. More information about the national and local events will come to us as we get closer to July 4th.

In this column I want to reflect a bit about this question: should churches have the right to endorse political candidates for public office, especially for national or state positions? Polls show that a great majority of Americans, Republicans, Democrats, and Independents, oppose such endorsement.

Concerns led to the amendment to the Constitution which prohibits 501(c)(3) organizations from engaging in partisan political activities and endorsements at the risk of losing their tax-exempt status. Some critics of this amendment see it as restricting Constitutional First Amendment rights, while supporters of the amendment agree that there needs to be clear separation of church and state.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has indicated that the policy of not endorsing and not opposing candidates be kept in place. That's our position. However, probably all of us have heard preachers speak out in favor of certain candidates or a political party. What should our Catholic Church do? We should speak out loudly and publicly about issues and principles which underlie those issues, policies that promote peace and justice, issues promoting the common good.

I hope that our parish and the people of our parish are strong advocates of that which promotes the common good.

My prayers are with you each day.

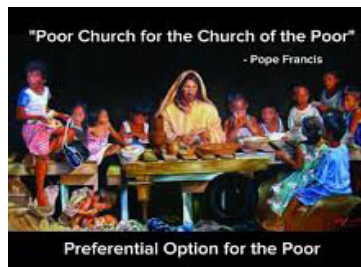

Meditating Moments



During this year's Lenten Season I participated in a group study at the Precious Blood Renewal Center, of Pope Leo XIV's apostolic letter, *Dilex te*, "I have Loved You". This title refers to God's preferential option

for the poor. I often feel conflicted as to the meaning of this teaching in my life; what actions is Jesus asking me to take in caring for the poor?

Fr. Ron Ronrolheiser, OMI states: "We need to give to the poor, not because they need it, though they do, but because we need to do that in order to be healthy." Indigenous people in North America practiced 'potlatch,' wherein as part of communal celebrations, richer tribal members give gifts to the poorer members of the community, insuring a more equitable distribution of goods. They believed too much wealth/excess made a person unhealthy.

Jewish scripture makes reference to providing for the poor, believing that everything we have belongs to God; human beings are only stewards and guardians. (See Leviticus 23, 25) Providing for the poor was not a negotiable moral option; it was the Law of Moses. There are references in Deuteronomy regarding slaves, their freedom, and providing them with enough to live independently. Debts were to be forgiven every seventh year and the land was to lay fallow. When crops were harvested, some was to be left for the poor to gather. On the fiftieth year all lands were to be restored to the original tribe or household.

In Christian scripture Jesus admonishes each of us to share what we have (if you have two coats, give one to the poor, etc.). As Catholics we are required to practice the Corporal Works of Mercy: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the prisoners, bury the dead, and give alms to the poor. For me these actions are not merely obligations but force me to see the face of Christ in my brothers and sisters, no matter their circumstances of life. Neither their appearance, race, religion, spiritual hunger, country of origin, citizenship, economic status, political beliefs, traditions nor physical, mental or emotional health are barriers to my moral need to give of myself in loving service to any person in need. Poor does not mean "**the other**". Rather the poor are "**my neighbors**" and Jesus insists I must care His parable of the Good Samaritan. Everyone is my neighbor: family, friend, community member, even enemies.

Lord help me to love and serve my neighbor; my spiritual health depends on this tenet. I remain your neighbor, servant, and sister in Christ,

Flag Day



June 14

Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. In 1949 President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th as National Flag Day.

Disposing Of A Flag: If your flag has become tattered or soiled and it's time for a new one. It's important to dispose of the old one in a dignified manner. The U.S. Flag Code states that the preferred method of flag disposal is burning it (throwing it in the garbage is not acceptable).

If you live in an area where you cannot burn it or are not comfortable doing so, here are some alternatives..

The flag can also be buried in a sturdy container. Many VFW and American Legion posts have flag disposal boxes available.

Juneteenth ~ June 19



Juneteenth (*officially Juneteenth National Independence Day*) a federal in the United States is celebrated annually on June 19 to commemorate the end of slavery in the United States.

The holiday's name, first used in the 1890s, is a combination of *June* and *nineteenth*, referring to June 19, 1865, the day when Major General Gordon Granger ordered the final enforcement of the Emancipation in Texas at the end of the American Civil War.

Juneteenth was recognized as a federal holiday in 2021, when the 117th U.S. Congress enacted and President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law, becoming the first new federal holiday since Martin Luther King Jr. Day was adopted in 1983.

Parish Religious Education Catechist FAQs



Our religious education programs are successful because of our catechists! We are always looking for more volunteers to join our team so we can continue to grow and provide an excellent religious education experience for our children!

Here are some questions you may have about becoming a volunteer:

Q: Who can be a Catechist? Do I have to have kids or grandkids in the program to be a volunteer?

A: Any adult in the parish, with or without kids, can be a catechist. While most of our volunteers do have kids or grandkids in the program, many of our volunteers have very young kids who are not old enough to be in the program or have older/adult children. We also welcome teen volunteers to be assistants!

Q: Do I need to have experience?

A: Nope! We always welcome new catechists with open arms!

Q: What are the requirements

A: All volunteers who work with minors must complete the Virtus training.

Q: I don't feel like I know enough about my Catholic Faith to teach others.

A: First, Faith is an ongoing journey and is a constant cycle of learning. Even the most seasoned catechists don't know everything! Second, we give you all the materials and resources you need to teach, including scripts for you to follow, so you know exactly what to say.

Q: What if I don't know the answer to a question?

A: That is ok! It is perfectly ok to say, "I'm not sure, but I'm going to find out and I will get back to you the next time we meet". This actually sets a great example of being ok with not knowing the answer right away and being willing to find the answer.

Q: What is the commitment like?

A: K-6 RE Classes meet on Sunday mornings from 9:10am-10:15am. Confirmation Classes meet on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month from 6pm-7:15pm. Camino de Santiago Meets on the 2nd Sunday of the month from 6pm-7:30pm (this group may meet on other days for service projects and other experiences)

Q: What if I can't make it to a class?

A: That is ok! We know life happens and conflicts come up; we just ask that you let us know when you cannot be there.

Q: I would love to help, but I don't want to lead or be the "main" teacher.

A: No problem! We can pair you up with one of our seasoned catechists who doesn't mind taking the lead with planning and teaching.

Q: Are we required to prepare lessons ahead of time? How much time does that take?

A: As we mentioned, we provide you with all the curriculum and resources you need to teach. We do recommend you take 30-45 minutes to review the material a few days before class, so you know what you will be teaching.

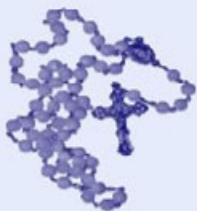

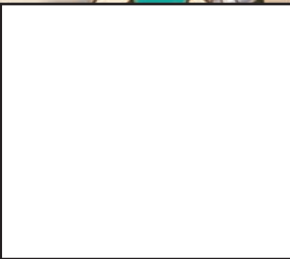
