

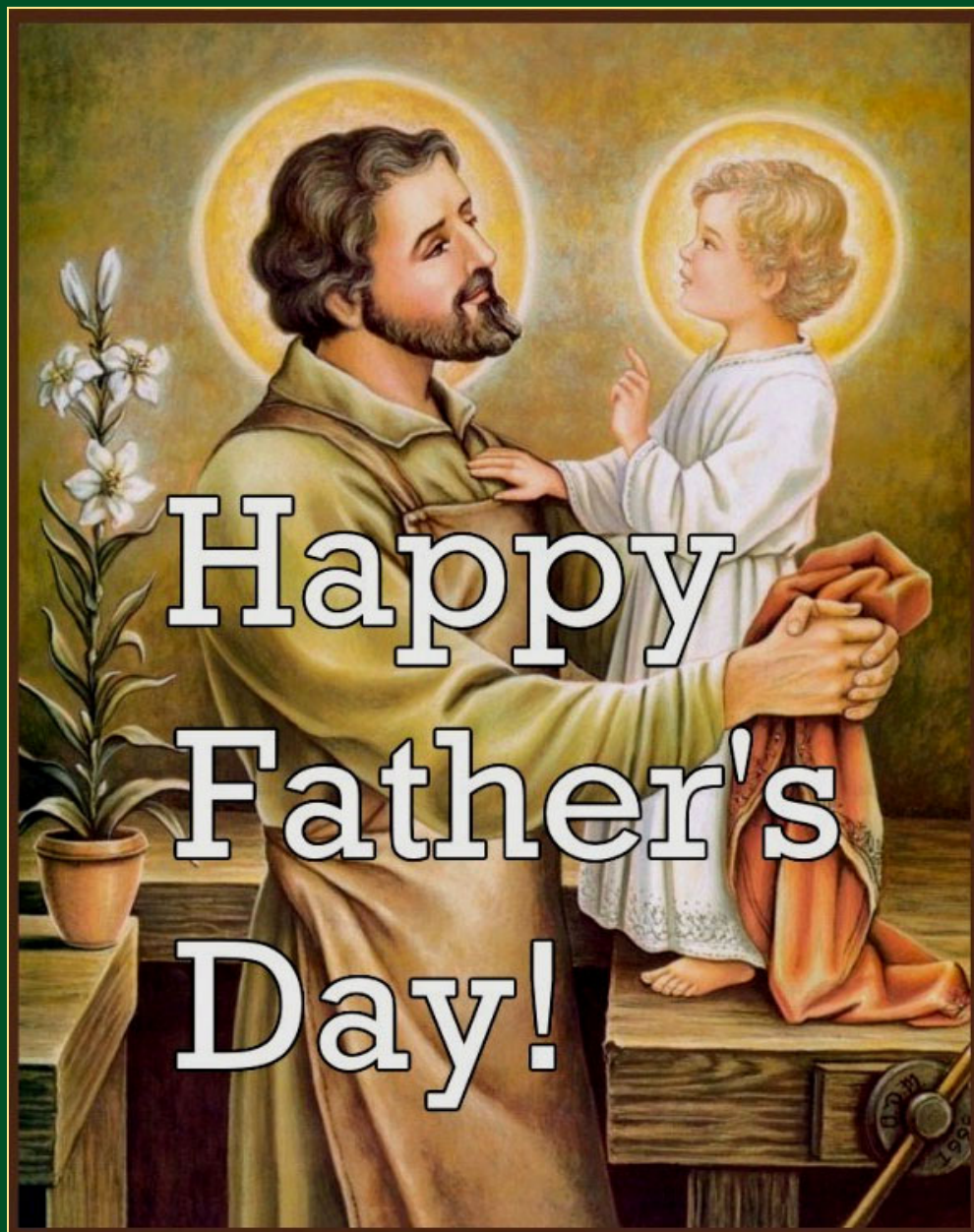

## From the Pastor's Pen

*"Fear no one."* (Matthew 10: 26a)

This very proclamation from over two thousand years ago this day rings again in our hearing. The sound and the effect of this assurance rang loudly in the ears of the "Twelve Apostles" (perhaps, minus one). Loudly enough to enable them overcome all the distortions of truth, all the deceptions due to personal interests, all the lies, all the tortures, all the banishments/exiles, even all the death threats in order to maintain trust and confidence in God's everlasting covenant.

The Prophet Jeremiah *"heard the whisperings of many: 'Terror on every side!'"*

There are people in every corner of the earth who are screaming at the top of their lungs, "Terror on every side," people known to us, people in Ukraine, in the occupied Palestine, in Lebanon, in Iran, in Southern Sudan, in Congo, and in many other places that are not in the news. There are muffled screams in the heart of many around us, fear of deportation; and those deported to places never known to them in their life!

Yet, we too, are nagged with feeling of terror due to the rising cost of living, the threats of changing and unpredictable weather pattern, and the diseases that do not yet have a cure. The twelve apostles were named (11<sup>th</sup> Sunday gospel, Matthew 10: 2-4) and sent forth with the mandate: *"Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons."* We, too, have been named (at baptism) and are being sent forth with the same mandate, particularly to *"drive out demons"*.

*Let us "without cost have received; without cost give."*  
(Matthew 10: 8)

## Meditating Moments



For several months I seem to be focused on the meaning of "Made in the image and likeness of God." Meditating on these words, I have difficulty understanding why there

are members of God's family, my human brothers and sisters, who continued to be objectified and treated as less desirable. I sense there are too many distinctions made regarding one's worthiness for basic human dignity and rights, justified by where or how a person lives, who he/she loves, their personal identity, economic status, religious beliefs/practices, color of skin, age, educational level, or their ability to be recognized as created and loved by God. Personally, I find this type of judgementalism totally contradictory to the teaching of Christ Jesus, recorded in Christian scripture. The refusal to believe that every person is created in the image and likeness of God, as a beloved child, is also contrary to **all** Catholic teaching. Pope Leo XIV reminds us that social justice is a pillar of our Catholic faith tradition, which demands encounter with all people as sisters and brothers. No one is an object to be used, forgotten, or whose life has no meaning. Jesus taught, "judge not lest you be judged," yet there appears to be a good deal of judgement today.

You may ask, "What axe is she trying to grind?" I have no agenda, rather I am trying to understand my life within context as a Christian, American, and a retired woman, who has been blessed in so many ways, while finding myself in an extremely divided world, nation, community, and church. Even among close friends I hesitate to discuss political, religious, moral, racial, and economic difference/disparity. I find myself searching ways in which I can contribute to the common good without prejudice and bias. Sometimes I wonder as my physical abilities and stamina decrease, if my acuity related to injustice and need to follow Jesus is increasing. Is it possible, realizing I am living in my senior years, facing the reality of my own mortality, that I feel an urgent need/desire to serve my sisters and brothers in ways I never envisioned? As I stated, I am searching and have yet to find a completely satisfactory answer. What I do know, however, is that there are many little things I can do, which seem to revolve around the teaching of Jesus when He was asked "Who is my neighbor?" My neighbor is anyone in need. I am called to serve, without listing my concepts or ideas of another individual's need. I am simply called to recognize, listen, and serve. I think this begins with my honest, loving presence to every individual, believing Jesus is present to guide me.

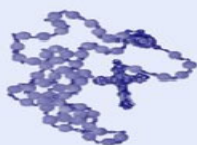

**The Month of June is dedicated  
to the Sacred Heart of Jesus**



This devotion began in the 12th Century and gained popularity after Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 1670s, revealing to her the image of His Sacred Heart.

Thus, it is a month dedicated to contemplating the wonderful mystery of the human heart of Jesus that contains all of God's eternal, infinite, self-giving love for each person.



In June of every year, we honor fathers. Mother's Day became an official U.S. holiday in 1914, but a holiday honoring fathers did not become official until 1966, when President Lyndon Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day.

Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972. But this doesn't mean that the holiday was not celebrated before this time.

The idea for Father's Day is attributed to Sonora Dodd, who was raised by her father after her mother's death during childbirth. While listening to a sermon at church on Mother's Day, she thought about all her father had done for her and her siblings and decided fathers should have a day, too.

Because Dodd's father was born in June, she encouraged churches in her area, Spokane, WA, to honor fathers that month. The first Father's Day was celebrated in Spokane in 1910.

Over the years, the idea spread, and people lobbied Congress to establish the holiday. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson, who had signed the proclamation establishing Mother's Day, approved the idea, but never signed a proclamation for it. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge made it a national event to "establish more intimate relations between fathers and their children and to impress upon fathers the full measure of their obligations."





## Kits For Kids Is Back

### Help Love INC Supply Hygiene Kits for Low Income Kids in Clay County

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

When we asked kids what they needed for back-to-school, they said they wanted to "look good" and "smell good." That is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. And the items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

#### How You Can Help

Collect the items below, place them in a clear one-gallon freezer bag (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

#### Here are the items the kids will need:

Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)

Toothbrushes (adult)

Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)

Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)

Bar Soap (bath size)

Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's))

Pray that all people of faith would be free to gather in houses of worship without fear.

The very nature of a sacred space is that it is set apart from other spaces as a place to seek communion with the divine and thus should be treated with respect. Terrorist attacks against Israel and ensuing outbreak of war caused antisemitic incidents in the U.S. to skyrocket, including shocking displays of open hatred, with acts of anti-Muslim hatred committed as well.

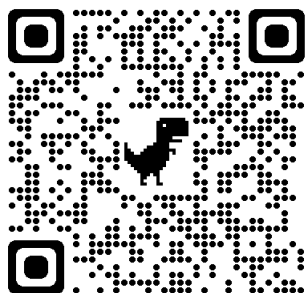
There is no greater threat to religious liberty than for one's house of worship to become a place of danger, and the country sadly finds itself in a place where that danger is real.

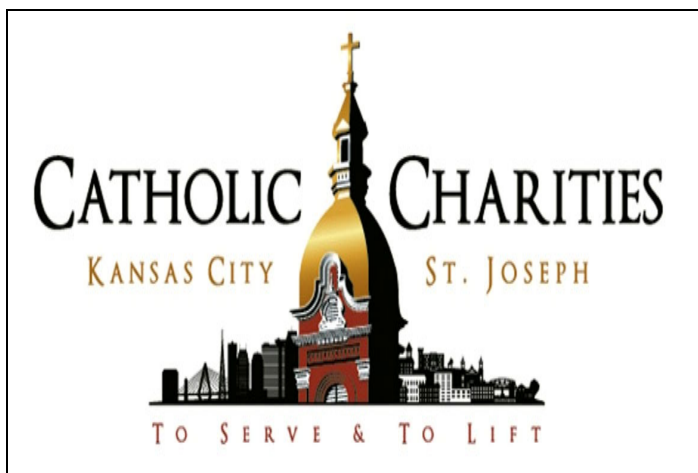

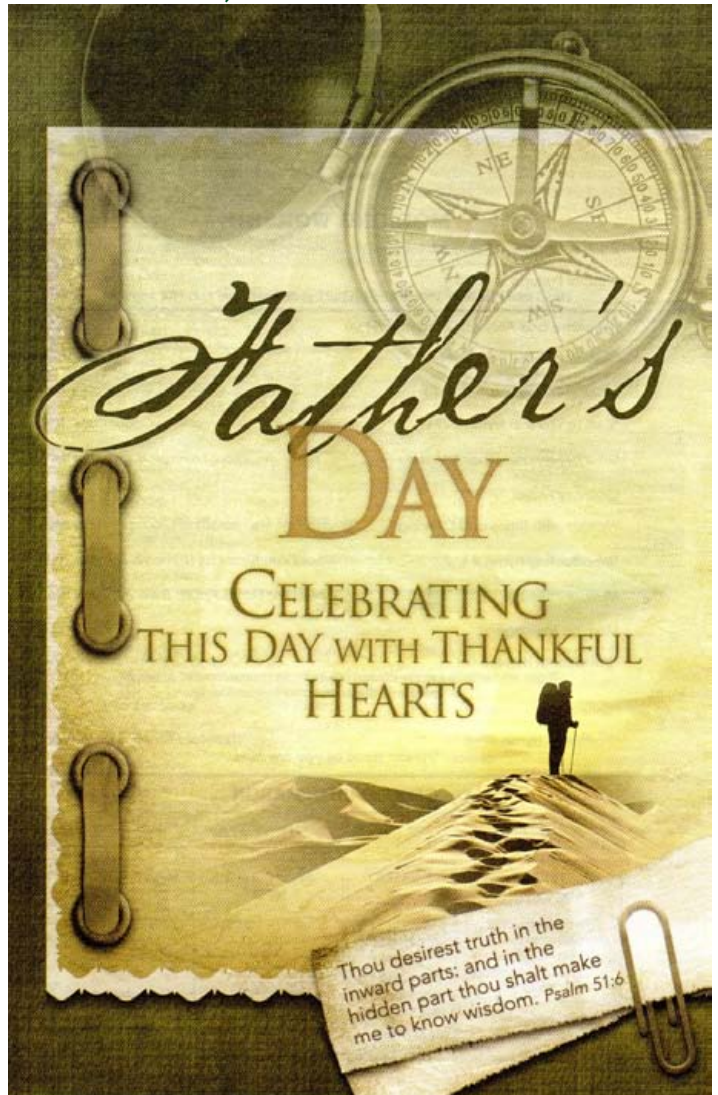

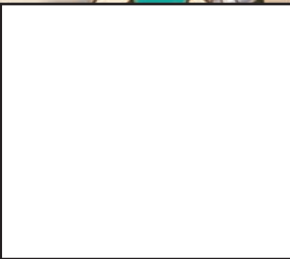
