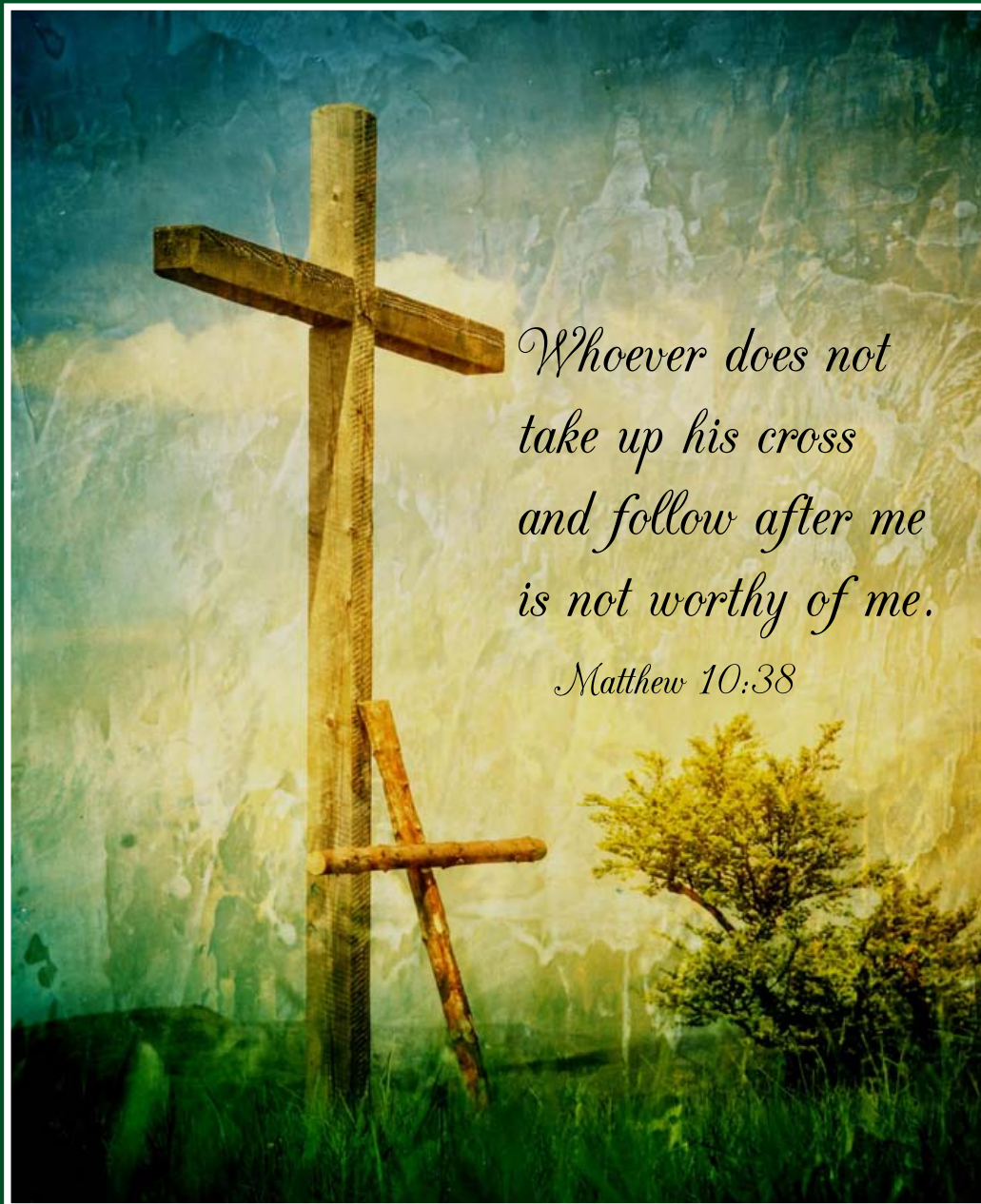

From the Pastor's Pen

One of the big items in the news recently is the announcement of a new 82-page encyclical letter of Pope Leo on the topic of artificial intelligence (AI) The Latin title is "Magnifica Humanitas."

Pope Leo urges governments, tech leaders, and society to confront the rapidly growing technology with its danger of weakening human relationships, critical thinking, and peace itself. In writing this encyclical, Pope Leo listened carefully to input from scientists, technology experts, political leaders, parents and teachers about the promises and dangers posed by AI. He cautions that AI must be "disarmed," that people be aware of the dangers that AI can bring. Yes, Pope Leo says, AI can be beneficial, but there needs to be careful scrutiny.

How will Pope Leo's words be received? Chris Olah, co-founder of the AI research company Anthropic praised the Pope for his willingness to engage the industry directly. Olah acknowledged that computer scientists alone cannot determine the ethical boundaries of AI. "We need informed critics who will tell the labs when they are failing," Olah stated. Another respondent said that the encyclical brings the vision of the gospel to bear on the cultures of AI.

It will be interesting to see how Pope Leo's encyclical will impact scientists, technicians, and, most of all, the general public.

We can be proud that our Holy Father had the courage and insight to engage in this critical issue.

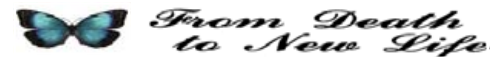

During his 2000 visit made the Feast day of Our Lady of Fatima universal by ordering it to be included in the Roman Missal.

Meditating Moments



In my journey of searching to understand God’s call to me, I came across an article by Fr. Richard Rohr in which he stated: “God is clearly more comfortable

with diversity than we are, and God’s goal and objective are much simpler. God and the entire cosmos are about two things: *differentiation* (people and things becoming themselves) and *communion* (living in supportive coexistence). For much of my adult life these two concepts were easy to understand as a microbiologist, chemist, and ecologist. The natural world (both biotic and abiotic) depends on diversity and coexistence. Whenever a species is lost from a biome, or becomes extinct, God’s creation suffers. Humans depend on this universal diversity as evidenced within our planet; think mountains, deserts, rivers, oceans, savannahs, lakes, marshes, icefields, and lush forests. There are hot, moderate, cold, dry, and wet climate zones. There are rocky untillable areas and rich tillable soil. Yes, human and other life forms depend on this diversity. Live forms also show great diversity: microbes, plants, invertebrates, vertebrates, with each of these categories divided and subdivided into unique creatures. Human life cannot exist without this diversity, gifted by God. Yet, we appear to deny diversity among humans, or weaponized human diversity to justify selfish wants and desires. Unfortunately, religious people of “faith” also use sacred texts to justify exclusion.

Jesus taught inclusion not exclusion. I think any use of scripture to justify exclusion is rooted in goals different than what Jesus taught. Point of fact, such justification seems to me to be rooted in power and control, fear, and idealization of a particular/secularized vision of idealized life, family, and traditions. Jesus did not treat people as simpletons who should be controlled by a rigid set of rules. Jesus accepted the complexity of humans and their lives. When Jesus was asked “Teacher, which commandment in the Law is the greatest?” He replied: “You are to love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and all your mind.’ This is the first and foremost, and the second is like it. ‘You are to love your neighbor as yourself.’

On these two commandments hang everything in the Law and in the Prophets.” (Matthew 22:35-40) Jesus allowed people the freedom to be themselves, to love and serve God according to their heart, mind, body, and soul. Within the great diversity of humankind, Jesus taught communion with God and one another. He did not teach division fueled by individual ego, person want, or demands.

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

When we asked kids what they needed for back-to-school, they said they wanted to "look good" and "smell good." That is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. The items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

How You Can Help

Collect the items below, place them in a clear one-gallon freezer bag (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

Here are the items the kids will need:

- Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)
- Toothbrushes (adult)
- Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)
- Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)
- Bar Soap (bath size)
- Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's)

Saints Peter and Paul Feast Day June 29



Saints Peter and Paul were the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and ultimate martyrdom there.

Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock', because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

In the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood."

Feast of the Most Precious Blood July 1



July 1st is the Feast of the Precious Blood and the month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood.

The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity.

The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

After Vatican II the feast was removed from the calendar, but a votive Mass in honor of the Precious Blood was established and can be celebrated in the month of July (and in other months of the year).

Best known for his initial unwillingness to believe the other apostles in their claim that Jesus had risen from the dead, St. Thomas can teach the faithful about believing without seeing.

When he was told about it by the other apostles, he said, "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe."

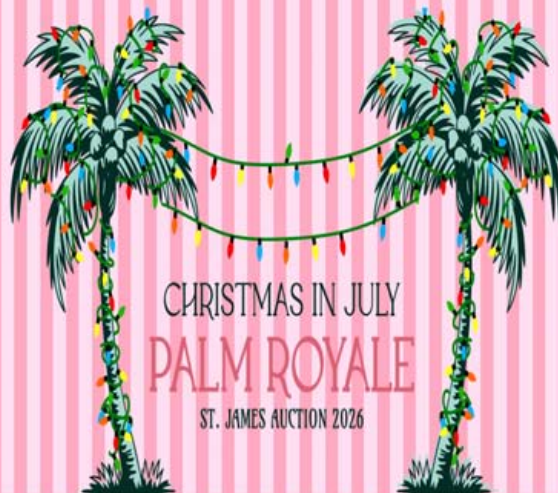
When Christ appeared later he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Pope Benedict XVI said "The Apostle Thomas' case is important for at least three reasons. "First, it comforts us in our insecurity; second, it shows us that every doubt can lead to an outcome brighter than any uncertainty; and, lastly, the words that Jesus addressed to him remind us of the true meaning of mature faith and encourage us to persevere, despite the difficulty, along our journey of adhesion to him."

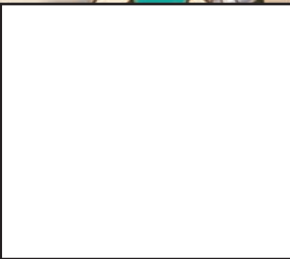
