**Kits For Kids Is Back**

### Help Love INC Supply Hygiene Kits for Low Income Kids in Clay County

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

When we asked kids what they needed for back-to-school, they said they wanted to "look good" and "smell good." That is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. The items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

#### How You Can Help

Collect the items below, place them in a clear one-gallon freezer bag (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

#### Here are the items the kids will need:

- Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)
- Toothbrushes (adult)
- Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)
- Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)
- Bar Soap (bath size)
- Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's))

Please bring the completed bags to Love INC no later than Wednesday, July 30.

## From the Pastor's Pen

*"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for your selves. For my yoke is easy and my burden light."*  
(Matthew 11: 28-30)

What an alluring invitation Jesus offered in the gospel today! Could what he said be too good to be real? It does sound rather simplistic to our ears. If we listened attentively, Jesus addressed his audience as *"little ones"* [literally, the simple, the uneducated]. But most of us who are reading or actively listening to this gospel passage are not children. Besides, among all peoples in today's world, we are regarded as an educated and highly capable people.

This weekend we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the founding of our nation built on the principles of freedom, equality and justice. I wonder if two hundred and fifty years ago in the Christian churches on this land the same passage from the Prophet Zechariah (9: 9-10) was proclaimed simultaneously with the declaration of independence. The Prophet declared this passage to the people who sought to rebuild their nation after having returned home from the Babylonian exile. This passage reminded the people of the God who always remembers them, saves them and comes to them as a ruler who is humble, just, and peaceful. On their part, they are to be faithful to this saving God.

On the dollar notes, the greenbacks, we declare: *"In God We Trust"*. The second reading from the Letter to the Romans that we hear today reminds us that the Spirit of Christ dwells in us who believe in God. And if we truly trust in God, we are urged to live out the Spirit of Christ who declared: *"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."* (Luke 4: 18-19)

May the Spirit of Christ nurture us in faith and empowers us to build a nation of peace, justice, and equality.

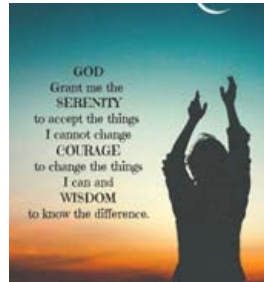

## Meditating Moments



On my sixteenth birthday my dad gave me my first car. Unfortunately I couldn't drive it. The car only had two wheels and was about two inches in length. Surprise! My first car was a silver charm on a bracelet. Over long years I collected a variety of charms for that bracelet; it be-

came a necklace, then two necklaces, and I still have a few unattached charms. Besides the car, my favorite is a simple, unadorned circle of pewter, inscribed with the words above, known to many as the daily, sometimes more than once throughout a given day. I pray these words, yet often ignore their simple message of acceptance, courage, and wisdom. I feel frustrated that my life seems such a contradiction. My thoughts are forward looking and hopefully loving, my words often strong, yet my actions are disconnected from my beliefs.

This weekend we celebrate 250 years since the first public reading (not the actual signing) of the Declaration of Independence. The first paragraph contains these words: "to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle [all people]." For me, nature's laws and God's laws are very simple; a place, function, dignity, and well being for all. The second paragraph continues: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all [human beings] are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness." Securing these rights, is the function of governments. Reflecting on these words, I am reminded of Jesus' words: "Do not judge." Although I am a unique and different being from any other, my life is pure gift from God who encourages me to pursue wisdom, peace, grace, forgiveness, and love. Jesus also reminds me, that all humanity, by the laws of God and nature are entrusted with these same pursuits. Unfortunately, my actions do not necessarily reflect the truth of such rights/freedoms for others. I am comfortable, perhaps stuck in my own small environment, hesitant to leave my judgmental nature behind and embrace the serenity, wisdom, and courage which I pray for so often. Reflecting on the principles elucidated in the Declaration of Independence, our Constitution, and my faith and love of Jesus, I realize and admit the time is now for me to "Let Go and Let God" show me the "Way, to Truth, and Life" not through my lofty, selfish, egotistical ideals and words, but through humble action. I must not, I cannot continue to wait.

### WHY WE CELEBRATE THE 4TH OF JULY

Variously known as the Fourth of July and Independence Day, July 4th has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1870, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution (1775-83).

In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then, fighting in the revolutionary struggle, weighed a resolution that would declare their independence from Great Britain. On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence. Two days later, on July 4th, the Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, which had been written largely by Thomas Jefferson. Though the vote for actual independence took place on July 2nd, from then on the 4th became the day that was celebrated as the birth of American independence.

Preamble of the Declaration of Independence

During the summer of 1776 colonists celebrated the birth of independence with festivities including concerts, bonfires, parades and the firing of cannons and muskets usually accompanied by the first public readings of the Declaration of Independence, beginning immediately after its adoption. Philadelphia held the first annual commemoration of independence on July 4, 1777. After the Revolutionary War, Americans continued to commemorate Independence Day every year in celebrations that allowed the new nation's leaders to address citizens and create a feeling of unity.

From 1776 until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with typical festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues. The most common symbol of the holiday is the American flag, and a common musical accompaniment is "The Star-Spangled Banner," the national anthem of the United States.

We need adult and teen volunteers to help with all our religious education programs.

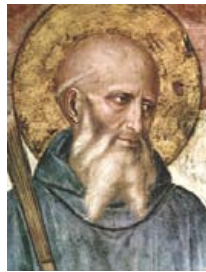

## St. Benedict Feast Day July 11



On July 11, we celebrate the feast of Saint Benedict of Nursia, the sixth-century abbot who gave Christian monasticism its lasting foundation in Western Europe.

He was born in Italy during the year 486. As a young man he spent three years in solitude, facing and overcoming severe temptations through prayer and asceticism.

Only after doing so, did he have the confidence to emerge as an organizer of monastic communities. His first monasteries were established in the Anio valley outside Subiaco, Italy.

St. Benedict was also the patron saint of Pope Benedict XVI's pontificate. In a 2005 general audience, the Pope said St. Benedict was a “powerful reminder of the indispensable Christian roots” of Europe. He cited the monk's instruction to “prefer nothing to the love of Christ,” and asked his intercession “to help us keep Christ firmly at the heart of our lives.”

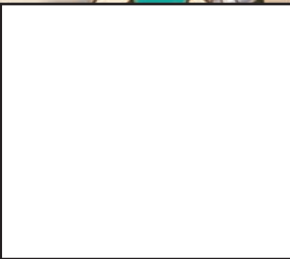
