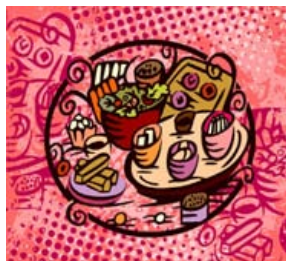
We, the community of St. James, are a prayerful and Eucharistic people who treasure our Catholic traditions.

From the Pastor's Pen

*"... the good seed [are] the children of the kingdom.
The weeds are the children of the evil one, ..."*
(cf. Matthew 13: 38)

These days, I find it challenging to keep maintaining that "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." (Psalm 34) It seems that the children of the evil one are overtaking the children of the kingdom who day in and day out are crying out to God for relief and deliverance. From hunger and thirst for divine intervention in prayer I look up to God requesting God's immediate action, but still, I wonder "where comes my help?" (cf. Psalm 121)

The second reading from Romans brings to mind a piece of the Christian's history in Vietnam where the good seed had to endure sufferings and death at the hands of the wicked for nearly 500 years - 1533-2033. For the most part of the last three centuries, the local Church had to endure many waves of severe religious persecutions by the rulers and by the zealous "patriots". The local Church are in the process of making preparations to celebrate the upcoming 500 years of Christianity's presence on the land (and in the lives of the people). The canonization of the 117 Martyrs of Vietnam on 19 June 1988 and the recent beatification of the Martyr Francis Xavier Truong Buu Diep on 2 July 2026 manifest that "the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings." (Romans 8: 26b)

Both the first reading from the Book of Wisdom and Matthew's Gospel passage lead us to the same focus: God is, not only compassionate and merciful, but also so forgiving and patient, particularly to those who want to turn their lives around. The postponement of the final judgment may seem unfair to the children of the kingdom, but does ring loud and clear that God does give second chance to those who accept it, and great reward for those who persevere.

Aren't Faith, Hope, and Charity the three Catholic foundational pillars (theological virtues)?

May we who have ears, hear.

Make time for an hour out of your day to give this life-saving gift.

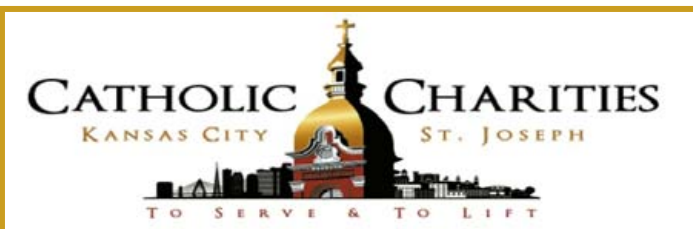

Meditating Moments



Webster's Dictionary defines hope as: "a confident expectation that desire will be fulfilled. . something which one longs to see realized. . a person in whom confidence is placed. . the virtue by which a Christian

looks with confidence for God's grace in this world and glory in the next." Reading these words I am confronted with the question, "Which definition best describes my understanding and desire for hope?" I want to believe the later words which place an emphasis on God but unfortunately I realize that too often I look to hope as the realization of the fulfillment of my expectations and desires. In other words, "Let my will and desires come to fruition." Realistically, I know that sentiment is not found in scripture.

St. Paul writes in the beginning of Chapter 15 on his letter to the Romans (1-2), "We who are strong ought to put up with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Each of us must please our neighbor for the good purpose of building up the neighbor." Do these words speak to my hope? Do I strive to build up the weakest of my neighbors? St. Paul continues: "May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another. . . Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. . . May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (verses 5, 7, & 13). In recent meditations from CAC (the Center of Action and Contemplation), Steven Charleston wrote: "Hope lets us literally see the presence and action of the holy in our lives;" Cynthia Bourgeault and Jon Batiste are respectively quoted as saying: "hope is the quality of aliveness - hope is the language of the invisible;" and Richard Rohr stated: "Hope is a participation in the very life of God. It has nothing to do with circumstances or events going well. It can even thrive in the midst of adversity and trial." These ideas of hope do not reflect a confident expectation of realizing my desires, rather they are an expression of my ability to trust in God's unconditional love and grace given to all who are created in the image and likeness of the one we call *Abba*. Building on my written words last week, I am convinced that singing is a spiritual practice that can fill our hearts and minds with hope. Howard Thurman in his work *I will Sing a New Song* builds on a phrase from Psalm 40, "He put a new song into my heart." Thurman wrote "I will sing a new song — I must learn the new song for the new needs — I must fashion new words born of all the new growth of my life — of my mind — of my spirit." Perhaps I need to sing a new song of hope in the Lord; a song in which I trust God enough to give my entire life to God's love.

Saturday, July 25 Feast Day of St. James the Greater The Patron Saint of Our Church



The son of Zebedee and Salome, "our" St. James is called "the Greater" to distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less", who was probably shorter of stature. He was the brother of John, the beloved disciple. Zebedee, his father, was a fisherman of the Sea of Galilee. Salome, his mother, was one of the pious women who afterwards followed Christ and ministered unto him of their substance.

James is described as one of the first disciples to join Jesus. When he first encountered Jesus, there probably was no indication that this was the day that his life would change. The dawn for him was not the bright beginning of a new day, but the end of long fruitless night of fishing. As James sat mending his nets in the boat with his brother John and his father Zebedee, he must have watched in wonder as his partner Simon brought in nets loaded with fish he had caught at the command of Jesus.

As Jesus walked towards James, followed by Simon and Andrew, He didn't pass him by. He stopped by their boat and called James and his brother John to do just what Simon and Andrew had done - follow Him. Without argument or discussion, James and John left their boat and even their father behind, and followed Jesus.

James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus chose to join to join him in prayer at the Garden of Gethsemane for his final prayer before his arrest and whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration.

Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel and the Roman kingdom as well. He traveled and spread the Word for nearly forty years in Spain.

The Acts of the Apostles records that "herod the king" (traditionally identified with Herod Agrippa) had James executed by sword. St. James is the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament.

Volunteers Needed For Meals On Wheels Ministry

Become a Meals on Wheels Volunteer!

The St. James Meals on Wheels Ministry supports the Liberty Meals on Wheels program by providing drivers to help deliver lunches to Liberty residents. Meals are prepared by the Liberty Hospital and delivered to a central location where volunteers then pick them up to distribute to recipients.

St. James is responsible for one route on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. The route begins around 11am and usually takes less than an hour. There are typically no more than 6 stops to make. Currently, there are openings on Wednesdays and Fridays. Volunteers can choose a set schedule or a flexible schedule.

Our volunteers not only deliver nutritious lunches, but they also provide the recipients with a friendly face to connect with, and someone to check on them throughout the week. It's a great way for anyone to stay active and engaged with the community. If you are new to volunteering, it's an easy and rewarding way to get started.

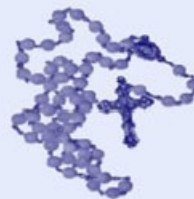

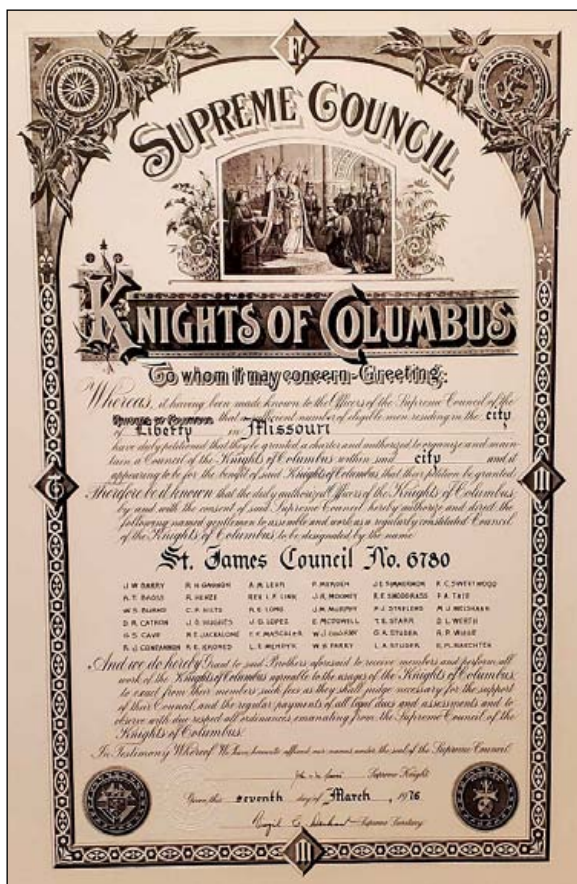

In the spring of 1976 after months of planning, 36 men finalized their work and became the founding members of St. James Council 6780 of the Knights of Columbus.

Today, 50 years later, 6 of those founding members are still with us, looking forward to celebrating a half century of membership.

Since that time each year membership has grown. Today Council 6780 has 327 members, Of these, 16 are honorary members, which means they have been a Knight 25 or more years and are 65 or older. Also included in the total are 42 honorary life members, 25+ years of service and 70 or older.

Help Love INC Supply Hygiene Kits for Low Income Kids in Clay County

Children living in poverty often go back to school without the basic items needed to help them manage proper hygiene.

When we asked kids what they needed for back-to-school, they said they wanted to "look good" and "smell good." That is why we work with local school districts and area churches to provide low-income families with pre-assembled hygiene kits at the start of each school year. The items aren't those tiny, hotel size products. They are full sized hygiene items.

How You Can Help

Collect the items below, place them in a clear one-gallon freezer bag (one of each item per bag for a total of six items in a bag. We will need an equal number of boy and girl bags.

Here are the items the kids will need:

- Toothpaste (2.5-5 oz)
- Toothbrushes (adult)
- Body Wash (12-18 oz, men's and women's) (avoid larger sizes)
- Shampoo (men's and women's) (you can substitute a "3-in-1" for a wash and a shampoo)
- Bar Soap (bath size)
- Deodorant (1.5-2.5 oz stick (men's and women's)

The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but we do know she was present with Christ during

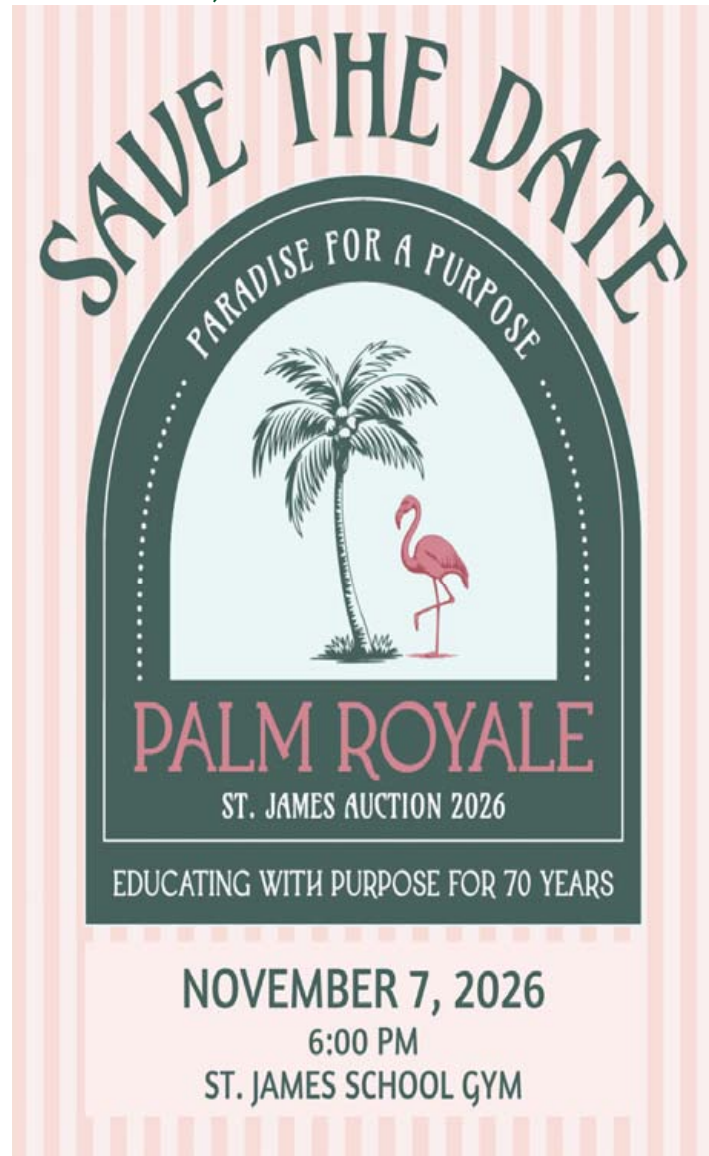
his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

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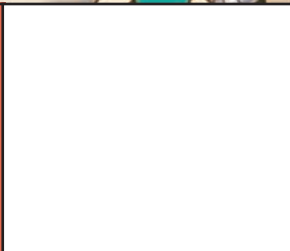
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
