From the Pastor's Pen

In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul writes: "all things work together for the good of those who love God, who are called for a purpose." How Paul's words touched the heart of Fr. Michael McGivney, inspired by God to found the Knights Of Columbus in 1882. Beginning with one small council in New Haven, Connecticut, councils now exist across our country and in many foreign lands as well. Fr. McGivney founded the council with a specific purpose: to assist need widows and orphans, so the mission of the councils today is to give material, monetary, and spiritual help to the needy today.

Yesterday (Saturday, July 25) the church celebrated the feast of St. James, patron saint of our parish family. So today it is most appropriate that we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the founding of our St. James Parish Knights Of Columbus. Some of the charter founders, such as Joe Barry, Ed Long, Larry Mendyk, Jim Mooney, and Don Worth are still with us.

Our local council is strong and vibrant, with 330 members and about 70 members attending our monthly meetings. About 80 members assist with our three Lenten fish fries. Members are involved in many events sponsored by the various organizations of our parish family. Our annual golf tournament raises about \$25,000.00, all of which support pro-life organizations and activities. Our current Grand Knight is Corey Murphy, who succeeded Ed Sczuka who just ended his two-year term. Many other knights serve in various offices and activities. As we celebrate 50 years of our knight's council, we recognize and thank the knights for their contributions to parish life and ask god to continue their good work

Meditating Moments



*"I am the Lord your God,
who brought you
out of the land of Egypt."*

Sometimes I wonder if God of the Hebrew Scriptures is sending the same message as Jesus of the Christian scriptures. For example, God of the Exo-

dus story seems remote, even harsh, unreal to my life. Metaphorically I suppose God leads me daily on an exodus away from my selfish wants and desires that lead to sinful behaviors. Yet, I do not feel that I am being pursued by anyone or any group that is trying to usurp my human rights, freedom and dignity. I believe I am free and have the ability to make choices regarding my life, without the constant burden and fear of being whipped into compliance. (Putting aside the fact there are times I feel beaten down, defeated, and forced to comply with systems existing in our world.)

Perhaps there is another way of understanding the Exodus as a faith journey through which I am seeking the Divine Presence in my life while asking God to forgive and lead me. Is the Exodus a symbol of my struggle toward greater freedom, empowered by divine grace and love. Fr. Richard Rohr wrote (CAC, February 22, 2026): "Israel is humanity personified. . . The story of Israel [the Exodus] symbolically describes the experience of our own liberation by God - and toward a universal love." God cared for the Israelites and God continues to care of each of us. This does not mean I will be free from personal trials, disappointments, and loss. I believe the truth that God never changes, I change; God never abandons me, I struggle not to turn away. God is constant and steadfast. God's love is eternal and God's forgiveness knows no bounds. Isaiah writes: "God will make the desert bloom" (35:1). From experience I know that even in my darkest times, God sends angels to show the light, flowers bloom through cold and snow, birds sing when I fall silent, and new experiences of beauty occur when and where I least expect it. I look around the world today and see so much hatred, division, bitterness, and professions of false holiness, but I also see examples of compassion, empathy, service, fellowship and love. I experience courage and understanding from others when I am lost in fear and worry. I hear words to lift me out of feelings of despair and hopelessness. My experiences with other people are part of my life-long exodus in search of God's presence.

My faith journey has been and continues to be filled with questions and unknowing. There are rocky sometimes cold mountains but also lush valleys with crystal clear running streams, metaphors for my life and its diverse experiences. My most cherished experience, however, is knowing God's abundant love and forgiveness. My faith journey is yet to be completed; my exodus is on-going.

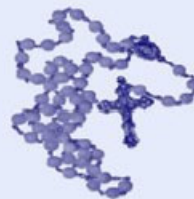

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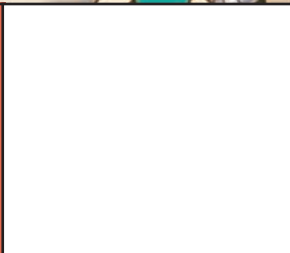
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
