From the Pastor's Pen

"Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect."

(Romans 12: 2)

Some years back when reading printed newspaper was still a part of one's daily routines, I remember nested in between larger columns was a small text box titled "Conventional Wisdom." To me, conventional wisdom was a collective knowledge that the majority of people experienced in the present trends of their life. If I were to follow the conventional wisdom of our age (time), it would be like borrowing the Prophet Jeremiah's lament, "I say to myself, I will not mention him [God], I will speak in his name [Jesus] no more."

In this present age, those who pledge belief and loyalty in the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob, and of course, the God of Jesus, are truly "duped" and the Lord has "triumphed." And from the crevices of their heart the responsorial refrain of this Twenty-Second Sunday is shouting out, "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God."

As I struggle through the daily life challenges, I keep hearing what Jesus said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! (=tempter/seducer) You are an obstacle to me. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

And like the Prophet Jeremiah, I have to admit that I am only human but hope to be transformed by the Divine (Jesus claimed himself in last Sunday's gospel, "The Son of Man").

Let us keep praying for one another borrowing from Saint Paul's advice to the Ephesians, "May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may know what is the hope that belongs to our call."

One question I have been asked many times is: "Do you have to be a Christian to be saved?" I do not profess to be a theologian, so I will attempt to answer this from my heart.

I do not believe God withholds the promise of salvation from any individual. Jesus did not enter human life to establish Christianity, God became man to teach all a new way of living. God is

love; creation was a gift of love; salvation is eternal love freely offered; humanity is graced, holy, and beloved.

The mystery of Christ is so much larger than historical Christianity. In my heart, I believe that Christ is universal rather than belonging to or contained within a single religion, moral code, set of ethics, or theology. Given my understanding of God which Jesus revealed, I cannot believe that God favors some people to the detriment of others. I cannot believe that the entirety of human kind lacks Divine Providence. I also believe that I should not judge others and I hope others will not judge me for my ignorance or lack of understanding.

I believe God hears sincere prayers even when those prayers do not reflect explicitly Christian understanding. I believe true relationships with God are heart-centered and not mind or intellectually centered. I believe gratitude, warmth, humility, reconciliation, and openness of my heart are needed for salvation. Compassion and embracing the gifts of the Holy Spirit are more important for my relationship with God than any externals. I trust in not only the visible Christ Jesus, His teachings, forgiveness, and love but also the invisible, universal Christ who is present to all humanity. I believe God is the creator of all that is good and is visible in the natural world and my human brothers and sisters, other religious traditions, and the secular world. I believe our Christian community, the sacraments, and the charisms freely given by the Holy Spirit strengthen me in my desire to love and serve God through loving, serving, and forgiving others as Jesus taught.

As I wrote last week, no one is an island living in a vacuum. I know I am interdependent with others. I also know I was chosen by God, not to be set apart or superior to others but to become an privileged instrument to share God's unconditional love, grace, and mercy. The Church has a special place, as did Mary the Mother of God, to participate in bringing to completion God's unconditional, universal, salvation. These words express my heartfelt beliefs and what I try to live by.

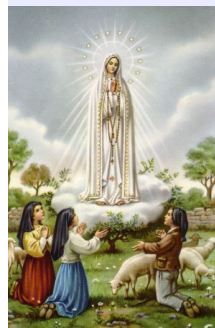

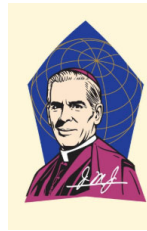

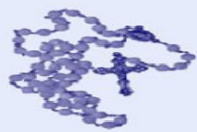
