Scott Carter, who leads the Wichita based cause for canonization on behalf of Fr Kapaun, will be on hand to present a portrait of the venerable priest to Fr Charles Rowe. Fr Rowe is accepting the portrait on behalf of Bishop Johnston as a gift of thanksgiving from the war veterans group.

From the Pastor's Pen

We are off and running with a new school year. We offer a prayer of gratitude for our St. James School principals, teachers, staff and parents for making our school one of the very best. Thank you, the parishioners of St. James and friends in the Community for their support of our school. We ask the intercession of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, who is credited for the founding of Catholic schools in our country.

This coming Saturday, August 29, there will be a special 11:00 am Mass for all Catholic Military Veterans and their families, as well for all who wish to join them.

The Mass will honor Fr. Emil Kapaun, a United States Army Captain who served a chaplain during World War II and the Korean War. A native of Pilsen, Kansas, he was ordained for the Diocese of Wichita. As an army chaplain, he was taken prisoner of war in Korea. After months of brutal captivity, he succumbed to malnutrition and pneumonia. He was praised and loved by fellow prisoners and by all who received his service.

Highly regarded, Fr. Kapun received the Medal of Honor, the Bronze Star, and the Legion of Merit. Remembered for his humility, bravery, charity, and dedication to his priestly calling, he was named a Servant of God by Pope John Paul II. He was declared Venerable by Pope Francis in 2025.

It is a foregone conclusion that he will soon be recognized as a saint. A picture of Fr. Kapaun will be presented to Bishop Johnson and accepted at the special veteran's Mass by Fr. Charles Rowe, the Vicar General for Pastoral Affairs. Catholic War Veterans are proud to have Fr. Emil Kapaun as one of their own.

Please know that my prayers are with you each day.

Meditating Moments



For much of my life I thought of myself as a very independent person. I believed in the American idea of being "self made" and "pulling oneself up by the boot-strap." Whenever there was a hurdle in my path, I believed I simply needed to work harder in order to overcome whatever blocked my journey. Perhaps

that meant changing direction or altering my goals. Dependency was something I tried to avoid, even when someone offered help. Hopefully as I age, I also gain wisdom. With wisdom, fleeting and small as it may be for me, has come the realization that throughout my entire life I have relied and depended on so many people. Everything I know, everything I am, is the result of relationships, interactions, and awareness of the ability to build on previous generations of people willing to share and advance human dignity and well being. The poet John Donne wrote, "No man is an island, entire of itself." These words ring so true as I reflect on my life. I never did, nor will I ever exist alone, in a vacuum. I live in relationship and realistically depend on others for existence. Take a moment or two to consider those on whom you depended today, not just parents, family and friends, but those unknown individuals who provided for your needs (think utility workers, trash collectors, transportation workers, etc.). Though I recognize my reliance on others, the aging process has forced a new perspective and awareness of my dependency and gratitude. Things I could do even five to ten years ago, today provide a challenge for which I must seek help. At times I feel frustrated. I also feel comfort and confidence knowing I am not alone. Even strangers offer assistance, especially when I am hot, tired, and sweaty mowing my lawn. I know God never abandons me and to paraphrase the words of a good friend, "When I am feeling lost and alone, most in need, God sends human angels to walk with me, guide me, and provide for me."

This summer our St. James community has said goodbye to friends and loved ones. Although we rejoice in the confidence that they are with God and believe we might be blessed in seeing them again, the pain of grief is real and at times harsh. John Donne's poem continues, "Every man is a piece of the continent, a part of the main." We are all joined as part of the human family. Logically, we each lose something when the earthly life of another is ended. Yet, like our dependency in life, we grow and flourish because of that person's life, which I believe never ceases to be a part of my life. In grief we lose but also gain. No one is an island. Christ is the vine. We are the branches.

Our St. James Picture Lady, Bulletin Editor, Web-Master and Signage Guru



Most of you know our "St. James Picture Lady." If not, I am certain you have seen the pictures she has taken that appear in our bulletin, on the monitors in the gathering space and narthex, on the website, or highlighting the electronic signage at the entrance to the church. In case you have not personally met this lady, let me intro-

duce her to you. Her name is Judy Crainer Keisling. I am fortunate to know Judy on a personal level, and consider her a dear and faith-filled friend. Judy is retiring from her role as Bulletin Editor, at the end of August after filling this position since 2015 and following her 90th Birthday. Let me introduce her to you on a more personal level.

Judy's father was the son of German parents and her mother's family immigrated from France in 1912. She has one brother who lives in North Carolina. Her father worked as a mechanical engineer, which required the family to move about the United States for his continued employment. Judy literally moved from one side of the country to the other, living in (to name a few) Syracuse, NY; Pittsburg, PA; Oakland and Los Angeles, CA; Utica and Watertown, NY; and Memphis, TN. Needless to say, she attended 9 different schools between kindergarten and 10th grade, graduating from high school in Memphis, TN. Following high school, Judy attended Memphis State College, majoring in Accounting, Journalism, and Sociology. During college, she was editor of the school newspaper and year book. One interesting event during this time, was her involvement in a campaign to change the name of her academic institution from



Memphis State College to Memphis State University. One celebrity recruited for this campaign was none other than Elvis Presley, and yes, Judy met him. She worked for Memphis Union

News for three years as photographer and editor.

Judy met her future husband, Ray Keisling between her junior and senior year. They married in 1958, working together as husband and wife until Ray's death in 2004. They were blessed with five children, Don, Denise, Ken and their twins Pam and Suzanne. Once again, Judy moved around the United States with her husband which eventually led to their working together as photographers and as commercial growers of iris.

Journalism and photography were not Judy's only jobs while raising five children. She also had a lengthy H&R Block career in accounting; writing training manuals; computerization of tax filing; preparation of

tax returns; and management. She retired from H & R Block as CIO, having served the company for 30 years.



Prior to the death of Judy's husband Ray, she states that she was a somewhat "fallen away Catholic." Although never losing faith, she did not attend Mass on a regular basis. Yet, she felt something was missing from her life. Following Ray's death, Judy received a letter from Fr. Joe Miller C.P.P.S. letting her know that

he was available if she needed someone to talk to. Thus began her return as an active, very involved Catholic. As previously stated, Judy became the editor/creator of our bulletin in 2015, at least in part through her acquaintance with Daryl Sweetland. Her role at St. James grew and grew through various volunteer activities such as leading the Over Fifties Group; Prayer leader for the Altar Society; Co-chairing the Welcome New Catholics/ Members to St. James with Pat Cull; helping develop the Website; maintaining and updating electronic display boards; helping with funeral dinners; lector; and almost any area where help was needed. She has been a gracious and helpful editor for any individual contributing to the weekly bulletin, especially myself. I do not know how I would ever have written *Someone is Watching and Wondering* or *Meditating Moments* without Judy as my friend, critic, and colleague.

Judy became a Companion of the Precious Blood in 2012. Charism of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood is rooted in the teachings of the Word of God and the healing power of the Blood of Christ, emphasizing community, reconciliation, service, and the inclusion of marginalized individuals. Their mission unites the bond of charity and service to the church, one another, and the broader community. Christ shedding of His blood was for St. Gaspar and for the Missionaries the sign of God's great love for all people.

Judy stated, she believes that through communication and volunteer service, she is able, as a Companion, to live the charisms of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Amen to that.

Judy is and continues to be an example of living in Christ and offering yourself to spreading the Good News through opening yourself to live in the presence of Jesus, holding Him, His love, forgiveness, and mercy in your heart.

Your service will remain in the hearts and minds of so many, especially me. I am honored by your friendship and pray for blessings as you enter this new phase of your life's journey. Thank You.

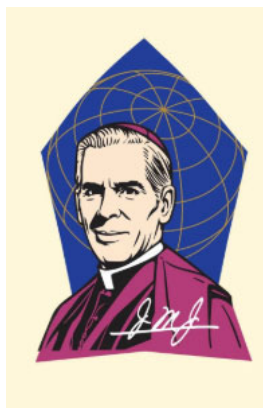

Note: The front parking lot often begins to fill by 2:00 on school days. The south side of the front parking lot is always available for church visits.

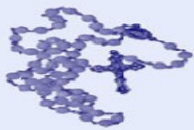

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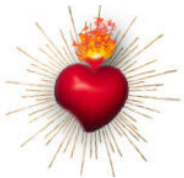

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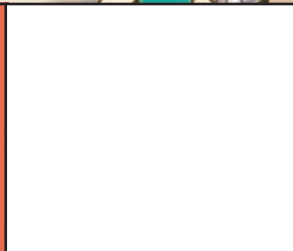
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
